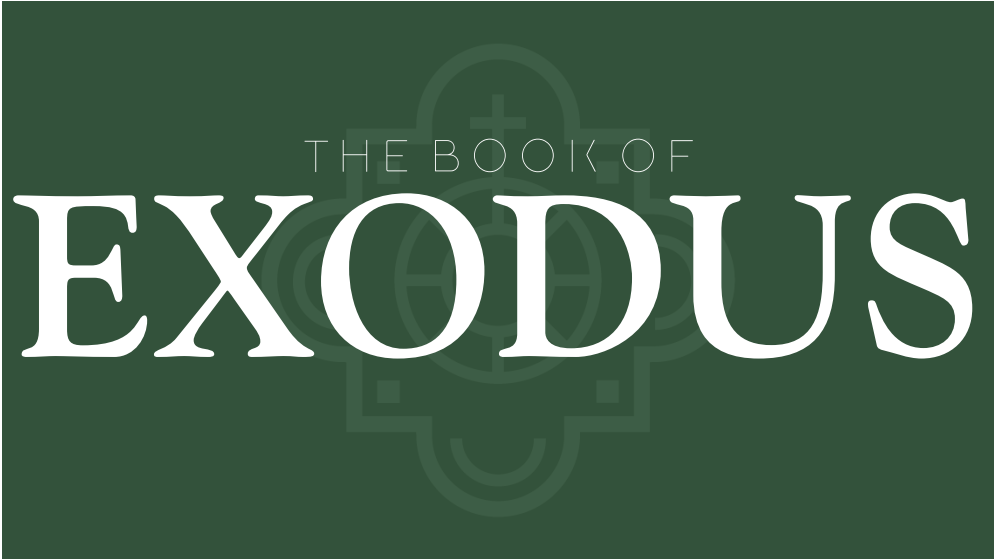
Women’s Ministry Bunco Night - Thursday, July 23rd @ 6:30pm
