Women’s Retreat - Saturday, 2.21.26 @ 9:30am

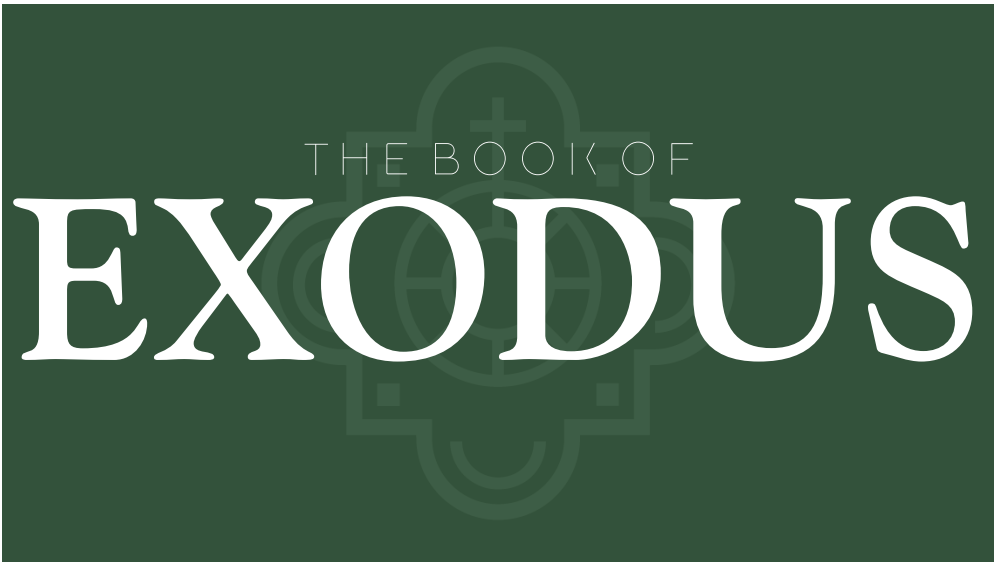
